Update from the Chair COSA Cancer Care Coordination Group

Thank you to all who attended, presented and participated at the COSA Cancer Care Coordination Conference held in March earlier this year. Speaking on behalf of the organising group and COSA, we were pleased with the success of the conference and the value you placed on it as an opportunity to network, and hear and learn from your colleagues in cancer care. The conference could not have been a success without the assistance of ASN Events, support of COSA and of course, convenor Douglas Bellamy and his team for the development of the program and the smooth running of the event. We were fortunate to have Professor Jessica Corner as the international keynote speaker and national experts to support the strong program. After the Conference the Executive met to discuss the direction of the Group's activities moving forward. In this discussion the group considered the current state of cancer care coordination and where it is headed, feedback from previous COSA Cancer Care Coordination educational events, and discussions had with and between delegates throughout the 2014 Conference. To summarise we will focus on a couple of areas initially:

- Completion of the position paper on the role of the Cancer Care Coordinator. This is our top priority over the next couple of months
- Develop a consistent strategy to communicate with the membership through the use of The Coordinator e-newsletter, regular email communication and discussion boards available to the membership for conversation on particular topics or areas of interest
- Webinars to support professional development of COSA members on key topics in cancer care coordination
- Work towards a 2016 COSA Cancer Care Coordination Conference
- Developing a model for service improvement activity by Cancer Care Coordinators which will include a corporate folder of key documents

The Executive has identified a need to revive the Communication and Networking subcommittee who have not met in over a year to progress some of these key projects. The Professional Development subcommittee will continue to operate to support the educational needs of the COSA Cancer Care Coordination membership.
