DUTIES OF THE POSITION:

The Palliative Care Clinical Studies Collaborative (PaCCSC) Postdoctoral Research Fellow will be responsible for establishing their own program of palliative care research, contributing to evaluation of findings, assisting with grant funding applications and specific research-related tasks of the Palliative Care Clinical Studies Collaborative (PaCCSC). PaCCSC national office is based within IMPACCT in the Faculty of Health, University of Technology Sydney, with some team members working at other locations in Queensland and South Australia.

The PaCCSC Research Fellow will have experience in research and scholarly activities and is expected to act autonomously on key research project tasks under the direction of their supervisor and project leaders, within the rules and guidelines set by the university. They will also actively contribute to nationally competitive grant applications and the publication and dissemination of PaCCSC clinical trial results, and to enhancing the profile of research within the Faculty of Health at University of Technology Sydney.

RESEARCH AND SCHOLARSHIP

- Undertake internationally competitive research
- Prepare research grant applications and tenders
- Seek and apply for competitive Fellowship and/or grant funding appropriate to level of qualifications/experience
- Coordinate and prepare research protocols, ethics and data applications and reports
- Conduct data analysis
- Publish and/or disseminate research outcomes
- Provide progress reports and a final report on the research program

TEACHING AND LEARNING / EDUCATIONAL DEVELOPMENT

- Contribute to and participate in research seminars as required
- Active participation in the supervision and training of research students
- Co-supervision or, where appropriate, supervision of major honours or postgraduate research projects within the field of the staff member's area of research
- Complete the Foundation Subjects of the *Graduate Certificate in Higher Education Teaching* and Learning (GradCertHEd) during the Fellowship

ADMINISTRATION, MANAGEMENT AND LEADERSHIP

- Administration of any research grant, as applicable
- Supervise technical or research assistants as required
- Apply for an external research grants and fellowships, and/or actively seek other appropriate funds from an externally funded agency or source
- Participate in Faculty and University community



- Involvement in professional activities including, subject to availability of funds, attendance and presentations at conferences and seminars
- Participate in the Early Career Researcher Development Programs
- Take a leading role in fostering research collaboration and research opportunities with other groups within University of Technology Sydney
- Other duties as requested from time to time

CONSULTING/EXTERNAL ACTIVITIES

- To work with project team members on a range of projects to conduct and manage a program of palliative care research
- Foster industry engagement and attract industry funded research projects

- The proven ability to obtain external grants for research
- Ability to analyse and solve problems

- Proven ability to publish in high quality journals
- The ability to successfully supervise undergraduate and postgraduate research students

Knowledge

- Understanding of palliative care research
- Practice in a clinical or health discipline
