In choosing the recipients of this award, regard is given to the nominee's achievements and ongoing contribution to the discipline of psycho-oncology in Australia.

The selection criteria are:

- Demonstrated excellence and leadership in their field
- Significant contribution to the discipline of psychooncology in Australia
- An inspirational role model for the psycho-oncology community
- Have worked in Australia in the field of psychooncology for a substantial period of time
- Membership of COSA and PoCoG
- Self-nominations will not be accepted

#### NOMINATION PROCESS

Nominations must be made by a member of COSA and/or PoCoG. Each nomination should include:

- An explanation of the nominee's work in the area of psycho-oncology care and/or research
- An evaluation of the accomplishments of the nominee
- Review and critical appraisal of the nominee's work from two individuals.

#### **NEW INVESTIGATOR IN PSYCHO-ONCOLOGY AWARD**

In choosing the recipient of the New Investigator in Psychooncology Award, regard is given to the nominee's research achievements and potential for ongoing contribution to the discipline of psycho-oncology in Australia.

The selection criteria are:

- No more than five years from completion of postgraduate, fellowship or equivalent specialist training (PhD, DCP, MD or equivalent)
- Demonstrated excellence in their field
- Contribution to the discipline of psycho-oncology in Australia
- Have worked in Australia in the field of psycho-oncology
- Membership of COSA and PoCoG
- Self-nominations will not be accepted
- Individuals less than five years from completion of postgraduate, fellowship or equivalent specialist training -PhD, DCP, MD or equivalent

Note: the award is linked to professional attainment rather than to age

### **NOMINATION PROCESS**

Nominations must be made by a member of COSA and/or PoCoG.

Each nomination should include:

- Nominee's curriculum vitae, with details of specific completion dated of degrees and post-graduate training
- Letter of nomination specifying why the nominee meets the award description above
- Two letters of support from other individuals to whom the nominee is known, also specifying why the nominee meets the award description above
- Copies of up to four publications that represent the nominee's research work
